**ORDER**

On this day, the Court considered the case. Prior to filing this lawsuit, Plaintiff filed four others, each alleging infringement of one or more of the same patents in suit here.<sup>1</sup> To facilitate efficient docket management, all related cases are ordinarily allocated to the Judge that was randomly assigned the earliest-numbered related case.<sup>2</sup> Therefore, and with the consent of the receiving Judge, the Court finds that this case should be transferred to the docket of Judge Alan D Albright.

Accordingly, the Court **ORDERS** that the above-captioned case is **TRANSFERRED** to the docket of United States District Judge Alan D Albright. Pursuant to the most recent Order Assigning Business of the Court, the Clerk shall credit this case to the percentage of business of the receiving Judge.
